PRESBYTERY NEWS

Presbytery Nominations – Can You Play A Part?

All Members of Presbytery should be aware that a Call for Nominations will shortly be issued to fill vacancies in significant Offices, Committees, and Working Groups within the life of the Presbytery.

With the sole exception of the Presbytery Treasurer, all other Offices (including Chairperson and Secretary) will require nominations to fill, as will the Chairperson positions, Convenorships, and Membership of all Presbytery Committees and Working Groups.

Members of Presbytery are asked to consider now what part they might play in the life of the Presbytery by nominating for one of the available vacancies. Alternately, you might consider those you know within the Presbytery who might possess the gifts and graces needed to make a positive contribution to the life of the Presbytery. Have a conversation with others – you might discover within yourself, or within somebody else, the capacities the Presbytery needs to carry out its administrative, financial, and pastoral functions.

Do you have a spare manse?

The Presbytery regularly receives requests for manses that could be used for accommodation for a variety of purposes. Here is one current request. If you are able to assist, please contact the Presbytery Minister, Administration, Dan Wootton at dwootton@victas.uca.org.au or tel 9857 1000.

Uniting ReGen, which focusses on alcohol and other drug services, is extending its residential youth withdrawal building at Moreland Hall in Coburg from 5 to 8 beds which is great. What is challenging is that we need to find a 4 bedroom home for rent while the construction is underway, probably January – June 2018. A house or manse in the north (say: Hume, Moreland, Darebin) of Melbourne which is available during these months would be of great assistance.

The program operates with 4 young people each week who are coming off drugs with 24/7 staff support and a full week of activities and education sessions. It is not a particularly violent or risky program and has a significant impact on the young people involved. The requirement is for an average 4 bedroom house for a few months.

COMMEMORATE THE 500th ANNIVERSARY OF THE PROTESTANT REFORMATION

An all-Melbourne-Church-event commemorating 500 years of Reformation, to be held in St. Paul's Cathedral, Melbourne, on Saturday 28th October from 2–4 p.m. We are looking forward to having Indigenous, Tongan, Korean, Chinese, African, German, Welsh, Indonesian and Swedish Church Choirs sing hymns in their own languages, interspersed with traditional church hymns in English. Our event features congregations who worship God in many languages sharing in celebrating the meaning of the mother-tongue for spirituality. Each one expresses the beauty and the individuality of how the Gospel is spread in Australia.

As we hear many languages spoken and sung, we can experience the variety of the Christian heritage in Melbourne. At our event, we plan to welcome the cross carried by the Catholic Charismatic Renewal movement. Church leaders from Uniting, Lutheran and Anglican churches will support the advertisement of this event to their suburban congregations. We are expecting that normal Sunday church goers, either from English speaking or from other language congregations, will want to join in this event. All of these people will be able to enjoy themselves singing famous church hymns in one of the great buildings in Melbourne, St Paul's Cathedral. They will also be able to join Church Unite in Federation Square following our hymn-singing event.

Finally, we will be joining the Roman Catholic - Lutheran commemoration service at St. Johns, Southgate on the same day, 28th October, 7.00 pm, featuring messages from Archbishop Denis Hart and Bishop Lester Priebbenow and the Bach cantata *O ewiges Feuer, o Ursprung der Liebe* (O eternal fire, origin of love).
