Congregational activity

Many congregations are starting to review the requirements for the resumption of face-to-face meetings and worship, but it is important that there should not be a rush to commence activities too quickly. Note that this is updated weekly, usually on a Thursday, so you should not assume that because you read it last week you are up-to-date with the latest advice.

Presbytery Meeting

A well-attended Presbytery meeting was held by Zoom on 30th May. We learnt much from this large gathering, and are now planning that the next meeting will be held in a similar way. Because of the limitation on numbers that could be managed, the invitation was not sent to Associate Members of Presbytery, but a copy of the draft Minutes will be circulated shortly.

Annual Mission Grants Programme in 2020

If you had been thinking about an application to the Annual Mission Grants Programme in 2020 then the following information will be important to you.

The Synod has advised that “no new applications for grants be considered from the Annual Mission Grants program (including funds from general reserves, trusts and bequests, and special purpose funds) and Small Rural Grants program in 2020 for funding commencing in 2021.”

We know that this will have an impact on those who were planning to

apply for grants. The Synod advice goes on to note that “The grants process being postponed is not simply a financial matter, but also an opportunity for prayerful discernment regarding how we ‘do’ Church in a radically changed world and how to work together as a whole Church to live most faithfully through these unprecedented times.”

One of the ways we can respond as a Presbytery is to look to our neighbour congregations to see who may need support for projects that would have been eligible for Synod Grants. Please raise this with your Church Council to see if there are opportunities for sharing your resources beyond your congregation.

Disability Royal Commission

Every congregation will have received information about the Synod’s response to the Royal Commission into Violence, Abuse, Neglect and Exploitation of People with Disability (DRC) announced by the Commonwealth Government last year. It is important that the two steps described in the correspondence are followed quickly:

- Please inform all of your members about the opportunity to provide stories about personal experience to the DRC; and
- Undertake a document search for information which may be relevant for inclusion in the Synod response.

ILLUMINATING FAITH RESOURCES

The second batch of new Illuminating Faith resources for 2020 have been posted on the [Mark the Evangelist web site](#). These are the first two parts of a study series based on a great online resource from Yale University – an introduction to the Hebrew Scriptures. With an engaging teaching style and supporting materials, Professor Christine Hayes leads groups through the content of the Old Testament and provides a useful introduction for lay people to modern historical critical ways of engaging with the text.
