PRESBYTERY NEWS

Warm greetings from the Presbytery of Yarra Yarra and its leadership team. While the Christmas season is a busy one for congregations, we hope that the past few weeks have also provided an opportunity for some peaceful and happy time with families and others you love. The Presbytery office has now resumed for the new year, and we look forward to working closely with you through what still seems to be a challenging time.

Updated advice on COVID restrictions

The Synod has advised us of an update to the Synod Frequently Asked Questions [document](#). This now reflects the advice received from the Government on 31st December 2020, and is essential reading for Church Councils and Ministers. Please pay particular attention to the information on pages 4 and 5 about electronic record-keeping.

In order to apply a rule of 2 square metres per person your congregation must have registered for and displayed a QR code, and then ensure that electronic registration is used for every person attending. A greeter will be required on every door by which the public can enter. Their role is to ensure that everyone entering the building registers via the QR code. For attendees who do not have a smart phone or tablet device, the greeter will need to register them on the greeter's smartphone or tablet.

Presbytery Inductions

We share in the joy of congregations who will be welcoming new Ministers over the next couple of months, and look forward to celebrating

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with them at the various induction services. We are still anticipating that these services will be held “in person”, but of course it will always be necessary to be aware of any changed conditions that may need to be imposed.

At **Carlton Church of All Nations**, Rev Ray Gormann will be inducted on Sunday 24th January at 2:30pm. Members of Presbytery planning to attend are asked to advise the Congregation Secretary, Dr Jill Tabart, at tabart.ken.jill@inet.net.au so that numbers will be known. Please respond before 20th January.

Rev Swee Ann Koh will take up a placement at **Manningham** on 1st February, joining Rev Claire Dawe in a team ministry. Details of the induction service to be held on Sunday 14th February at 2 pm. Further details will be available shortly.

An induction service is also being planned for Rev Carlynn Nunn, who has commenced her placement as Chaplain to the **University of Melbourne**. The placement is also associated with the congregation at Wesley in Lonsdale Street. The induction will take place at the University on Wednesday 17th March at noon, to fit in with the academic year. Further details will be known closer to the date.

Congregation Details Update

This is the time of year when we try to ensure that all congregational details are up-to-date. With this newsletter there is a blank spreadsheet requesting details of your congregation, your congregational Minister(s) and office bearers, and details of all paid workers. If you are a Church Council Secretary please make sure this is completed and returned by the end of January.

Each Church Council is required to prepare and present to the congregation each year an annual report concerning the life and work of the congregation (Regulation 3.1.2(x)). It is very helpful to the Presbytery if a copy of each report can be forwarded to the Presbytery. If your Church Council has not done so recently, please send a copy of your latest report to the Secretary.
