BOOK LAUNCH: COMMUNITY ENGAGEMENT AFTER CHRISTENDOM

Dr Doug Hynd has had a long career as both a public servant and a theologian, lecturing at St Mark's Theological College in Canberra. In his retirement, he is deeply involved in supporting asylum seekers. He has just written a book on how the churches (and Christians more generally) should engage with the wider community and with government. While this book is particularly relevant to those people who are involved in obtaining government funding for church programs, it is of much wider interest as we all reflect on how we should relate to the wider society.

The book will be launched on Tuesday 24th May 2022 at 4:30 pm at St Pascal's Hall, University of Divinity, 90 Albion Road, Box Hill.
