PRESBYTERY NEWS

Presbytery meetings

The recent Presbytery meeting on Saturday 28th May was held at the new Manningham worship centre. The Chairperson was pleased to be able to chair a face-to-face meeting for the first time since her installation, and it was encouraging to see a good attendance, with about 75 people present. The sad aspect to this is that we currently have 158 members of Presbytery, so we are still seeing an attendance of less than 50%. In addition, we have quite a few congregations who have not appointed a presbytery representative, including some who do not have a Minister in placement. This means that those congregations are not able to have their views represented or to share in the communal and wider life of the Church. If a representative is not appointed, perhaps the role could be seen as part of the responsibilities of the Church Council Chairperson.

Important decisions made at the meeting include:

- Recognition that James Tang is approaching the end of his formation for ministry period and is now ready for ordination once he completes any remaining requirements, and is given and accepts a placement.
- Extensions of the placements of Rev Tony Lai at Melbourne Gospel Hall and Rev Deacon Natalie Dixon-Monu in her presbytery placement at Boroondara Community Outreach.
- Amalgamation of the Healesville and Yarra Glen congregations.
- Closure of the Doncaster Loving Church congregation.
- Recognition that the combined role of Secretary and Presbytery Minister Administration needs to be a full-time position.

Following the pattern of using these meetings to address a particular issue, the topic will be “The Church at Mission”, and we look forward to being led in this discussion by our Presbytery Minister Congregations, Rev Dr Sunny Chen. Some people had a very small foretaste during Sunny’s “Lectionary through a Greek” session this week, so know that it will be both interesting and insightful. The venue for the August meeting, on Saturday 27th August, will be Greensborough. More details will be provided closer to the meeting.

Annual Reports

By now most congregations will have held their annual congregational meetings to receive reports from last year, and to consider financial reports and budgets. However, we are still waiting for many to send the reports to the Presbytery. Synod meeting

The 2022 meeting of the Synod takes place in just over a week, and it is encouraging to note that Yarra Yarra Presbytery has been able to appoint a full quota of members. Please include prayers for the Synod and the incoming Moderator, Rev David Fotheringham, in your services over the next couple of weeks.

Meeting Together

A major item at the last presbytery meeting was the launch of the new resource “Meeting Together”, published by the Synod after much work by the Presbytery eLM Ministers. Each congregation has received two copies of the booklet, and we hope that these have by now been shared with all members of Church Councils.
