Presbytery Secretary Reg 3.6.2

Secretary

The Presbytery shall elect a secretary for such period up to five years as the Presbytery may determine. The secretary shall be a confirmed member of the Church.

The duties of the secretary shall include:

- (i) convening meetings, preparing the agenda and keeping a record of all proceedings of the Presbytery;
- (ii) attending to all other correspondence on behalf of the Presbytery, including advising all affected parties of the decisions of the Presbytery;
- (iii) maintaining and having custody of the books and records of the Presbytery, including the roll of the Presbytery, except such as may be assigned to other officers;
- (iv) furnishing information and reports to the Synod and Assembly and to other bodies as required;
- (v) dealing with property, disciplinary and other matters in accordance with Regulations;
- (vi) performing such other duties as may be assigned by the Presbytery. Should the secretary be temporarily unable to perform the duties of the office or should the office of secretary fall vacant, the Presbytery may appoint an acting secretary who shall have full authority and responsibility to perform all the duties of the office until such time as the secretary is available to resume those duties or another secretary is elected.

Morning tea with the Ukranian ambassador

Lindsay Herbert, Presbytery Rep. - Deepdene Uniting Church congregation.

Three members of DUC were invited to meet with the Ukrainian Ambassador recently. About 20 recently arrived Ukrainian refugees were present along with about 10 already settled Ukrainians who have been supporting them. As part of its missional outreach, the DUC has allowed space at its property to be used as a site for collection, storage and distribution of good quality used clothing and household goods for recent refugee arrivals, many of whom arrived in Melbourne with little more than the clothes they were wearing.

The Ambassador recognised and thanked the Australian people and Government for the support offered in the current difficult situation. The Ambassador recognised that whilst some of the refugees clearly want to stay in Australia, others expect to return when peace is re-established, to help rebuild their country. Mention was also made (by the local Liberal party member) of the difficulties our Government creates for these people by not providing them with long term visas which allow them to work and have benefits such as Medicare and free schooling. Those arriving now are only provided with Tourist Visas which last 3 months.

We thank God that we are able to offer this aid to these very distressed people.

Geoff Barnes Prize Fund for theology students

A prize for theology students studying history

A prize has been set up for the best essay in history undertaken by an undergraduate student in any Uniting Church theological college. While essays about the Uniting Church or its precedent bodies are welcomed, this prize is not limited to those themes, and may be on any historical period or aspect of historical study. The essay should already have been assessed by the college and received a grade result of 75% or higher. Nominations are by a member of academic staff, with the consent of the student. The amount of the prize is currently \$250 subject to increase as the fund grows.

The fund & prize are now managed by the UC National History Society (UCNHS) on behalf of Assembly, replacing an earlier Committee 2017.

About Rev Dr Geoff Barnes

The Rev Dr Geoffrey Barnes (1926–2005) was born and educated in Melbourne and ordained a Congregational minister in 1951. In 1967 he moved to Sydney, to serve as Principal of Camden Theological College and later as Lecturer in Church History at United Theological College from 1975-1993. He was Moderator of the NSW Synod from 1987-1988.

Personal footnote

The only time I met Geoff was at a Sunday evening East St Kilda Congregational church anniversary talk, presented by him in 1993. It was the only occasion when I experienced that church completely packed. I took the last seat available.

Geoff was, in his youth, a friend of my Uncles Frank and Gil and Mum at the East St Kilda Church. Being nurtured in youth group and church influenced how he was led to become a Minister. He was the only one to go into Ministry out of East St Kilda. The Church continued to remember him in prayer in worship, throughout his career. Having a Minister come from your number was a matter of great pride for a Congregational Church.
