Black/Beautiful: Song of Songs 1:5, and the Historical Question of Blackness

In Song of Songs verse 1:5: the bride proclaims: 'I am black and beautiful, daughters of Jerusalem'. Jewish, Greek and Latin scholars sought to draw allegorical meanings from the verse and their efforts became more pointed, often polemical, after Jerome translated the verse in the Vulgate as 'black but beautiful'. Since the Song of Songs attracted so many commentators ever since, this verse also offers an opportunity to probe ideas about blackness as these were discussed and developed over the centuries.

This Lecture will present the ideas about blackness inspired by this verse, as a contribution to discussion of race and racialisation in the premodern past.
