The Testimony of Scripture


Your word, O Lord, is a lamp to our feet *and a light to our path.*

Today's readings are the 'next' in our series on Ephesians (not always sequential!), a psalm which complements the Ephesians reading and the set Revised Common Lectionary gospel for this Sunday.

Ephesians 2.1-10 For we are what God has made us in Christ Jesus

Psalm 89.1-8 Who among the heavenly beings is like the LORD? [PCS Tone 3, p343]

REFRAIN: Organ, then cantor, then all together (sung also at the end). The psalm text is then sung responsively to the TONE


The Lord's Prayer
