- Congregational responses are printed in *bold italics*.
- Pray for those who will be leading us in our worship today!
- There are a couple of seasonal changes to reflect the Easter season. We switch to the "Erfreuen" ("Rejoice") setting for the communion responses, although without the sung Kyrie or the Lamb of God elements. We also stand for the gospel and share in a sung acclamation, with a few other alleluias thrown in through the service!
- Today's psalm will be sung responsorially in the congregation: each side of the centre aisle singing alternative lines. Read through the psalm before we get there, to familiarise yourself with its rhythm.





Lift up your hearts.


We lift them to the Lord.

LITBIT: The centrepiece of this part of the liturgy is The Great Prayer of Thanksgiving. The origins of this central Christian prayer lie in Jewish prayer at Passover and in the grace at every meal. Jesus built on these at the Last Supper. Our present sacrament also derives meaning from other meals hosted by Jesus - e.g. after the resurrection at Emmaus (Luke 24), or by the seashore (John 21). Its essence is thanksgiving for the mighty acts of God. It is a 'Great' Prayer because it is the expression of all the gifts of God for our salvation, above all in the life, death and resurrection of Jesus Christ. UNITING IN WORSHIP 2

If you can't stand or walk to the front but would like to receive communion, please raise your hand if the celebrant has not already noticed you.
