

The Visible Word: Eucharist

LITBIT: ...the meal that we keep, in its intensity and focus, its staple and food festive drink, its ceremonial welcome of a wide circle, might suggest that we are consuming magical food, food of the angels, a heavenly banquet, food that will grant us immortality. Then we hear the content of the feast: "the body of Christ, the blood of Christ, given for you." A specific, real death is proclaimed, and if "immortality" is given, then this is a new kind of freedom from death, coming in a world-affirming, bounded, palpable, and mortal way, here.






The Lord's Prayer
