That the churches may discover again their visible unity in the one baptism which incorporates them in Christ, let us pray for the love of Christ:

R: O Lord, hear our prayer.

That the churches may attain communion in the eucharist around one table, Let us pray for the strength of Christ:

R: O Lord, hear our prayer.

That the churches may recognize each other's ministries in the service of their one Lord, let us pray for the peace of Christ:

R: O Lord, hear our prayer.

It is right to give our thanks and praise.






The Lord's Prayer

Rabbi Micky Boyden, Israeli progressive rabbi and saught after speaker presents:

Rabbi Michael (Micky) Boyden was born in London and is a graduate of London University and the Leo Baeck College. He served a reform congregation near Manchester and was Vice President of the Assembly of Rabbis of the Reform Synagogues of Great Britain, before moving to Israel in 1985. He has since founded Rabbis For Israel and was directly involved in the establishment of an advocacy group called 'We Are For Israel', which was supported by hundreds of rabbis and Jewish leaders worldwide. He is also a past President of the Israel Council of Progressive Rabbis and served as director of its national Rabbinic Court for Conversion. In Israel he pioneered the establishment of two Reform congregations and is now the spiritual leader of 'Kehilat Yonatan'. He is a frequent international speaker, particularly on the topics he will cover in this presentation, and writes regularly for the Ha'aretz and The Times of Israel newspapers.
