



Albania

Albania has been successively part of the Roman, Byzantine and Ottoman empires. It became independent in 1912 and was a monarchy from 1924 to 1939, when it was invaded by fascist Italy. The Albanian Communist Party, formed in 1941, seized control of the country in 1944, installing one of the harshest communist dictatorships of modern history. Under Enver Hoxha, Albania was declared an atheist nation in 1967, and all religious and traditional beliefs were forbidden. It was a fear-driven regime, clamping down on all who resisted, intellectuals, clergy, and other opponents. Many Orthodox and Catholic bishops and priests were killed or sent to prison. Albania was politically and economically isolated from the rest of the world, including the communist world. In 1990, in the context of the end of the cold war and under internal pressure within the party and by the people, the communist regime collapsed. Since then, Albania has gone through several crises of instability, due in part to the conflicts in the Balkans. The political and economic situation is improving, but slowly. The two largest churches, Orthodox and Catholic, have re-established themselves. Islam has also re-affirmed itself in Albania. There has been a considerable influx of Evangelical, Pentecostal and other Christian faith missions. Relationships between the faith communities are on the whole tolerant. There is no council of churches.

Croatia

Today's Croatia was comprised of the Austro-Hungarian Empire until the end of the First World War, when Croatia joined the kingdom which, in 1929, became Yugoslavia. Croatia declared independence in 1991. Almost immediately, the country was afflicted with civil war as the Serbian minority (in control of much of the army) fought to create a Serbian state. The war continued until 1995. There were serious human rights violations during the conflicted inflicted by both Croatians and Serbs, including massacres and the widespread use of rape, as well as considerable destruction of villages and houses. The Roman Catholic church has a long history in Croatia, but in 1945 a bloody era of persecution began that lasted into the early 1950s. Many clergy were imprisoned, tortured, and even executed. In 1990 Roman Catholic clergy succeeded in establishing mandatory religious instruction in public schools. Ecumenical activities have recently resumed. There are no WCC member churches based in this country.

MtE at Mission

- At its most recent meeting (April 1), MtE Church Council resolved to make a donation of \$5000 to the Act for Peace Middle East Appeal, in response to the ongoing crisis and deep need in Gaza. The CC encourages members of the congregation to consider making personal donations via <https://actforpeace.org.au/middle-east-appeal/> and support for the filming of "The Other" at a date and time TBC
- The CC also agreed to partner with the Synod's Justice and International Mission Unit in the screening of the documentary *The Other*, which relates the efforts of Israeli and Palestinian peace activists in Israel. Details of the screening are still to be finalised (trailer: <https://weuncoverfilms.com/theother/>)
- The CC agreed to funding to establish a ministry to/with children, in cooperation with other UCA congregations in our area. Work on this will commence after Easter.
- The congregation has provided three sets of study books for the CTM's Otira Theological Library, which have featured in recent issues of Crosslight.
- AND, we are involved in setting up a Candidates' Forum for the seat of Melbourne, to be held at 5.30pm on April 29 at Wesley Uniting in Lonsdale Street.
