## A SERVICE OF WORD AND SACRAMENT

**Prelude** JS Bach, *Christ lag in Todesbanden*

### **Processional Chant: Christ is risen**

The chant commences with the first line, with subsequent lines being overlaid along the way. The first line is the easiest, and you can stick to this all the way through if that's where you're most confident!

**Group 1** is the bank of seats closest to the entry doors; **Group 2** is the central bank of seats; the "**High voices**" can be anyone (or none!) who wants to join in.

### The Preaching of the Word

### Reaffirmation of Baptismal Vows

*(The congregation stands)*

Sisters and brothers,  
in our baptism, we died and were  
buried with Christ,  
so that we might rise with him to new  
life.

We were initiated into Christ's holy church  
and brought to life through water and  
the Spirit.

God's mighty acts of salvation for us  
and for all people  
are gracious gifts, freely given.

As we reaffirm our baptism,  
we declare our common allegiance to Christ  
and seek to be obedient to his will.

And so I ask you now:

Do you turn to Christ?  
***I turn to Christ.***

Do you repent of your sins?  
***I repent of my sins.***

Do you renounce evil  
and the false values of this world?  
***I renounce them.***

And now I ask you to confess the faith  
into which you were baptised,  
and in which you continue to live and grow:

Do you believe in God,

creator of heaven and earth.***

**LITBIT:** "To be baptized is to

Human beings have let go of that  
identity, abandoned it, forgotten  
it or corrupted it. And when

### Russian Federation

All the Christian churches and other religious groups suffered severe persecution under the atheist communist regime of the Soviet Union, which disintegrated in 1991, but in particular the Russian Orthodox Church, as the majority church and the locus of Russian religiosity. Among the Protestant and other churches are Baptists, Pentecostals, Seventh-day Adventists, Lutherans (mostly ethnic Germans and Finns), Methodists (which are part of the United Methodist Church), and several separatist Orthodox churches. An Interconfessional Committee was formed for dialogue between Orthodox, Catholics and Protestants but was not operational through 2005.
