NORTHEY LECTURE (CTM, 6.30PM, THURSDAY SEPTEMBER 4):

Why Global Solidarities are a Matter of Life and Death: The Difference

Religion Can Make

Even though the globe is moving closer together, solidarity among people appears to become more difficult. Nationalisms, racisms, ethnocentrisms, and sexisms are on the rise, dividing and conquering and thereby producing false solidarities. While religion is often part of the problem, it can also become part of potential solutions. As the apostle Paul observes, "if one member suffers, all suffer together with it" (1 Cor 12:26). This insight may hold true not only for personal relationships and communities but also for our global situation. The solidarity that emerges here goes deep, as it reconnects us with people, planet, and the divine.

The lecturer, Professor Joerg Rieger, is Distinguished Professor of Theology and the Cal Turner Chancellor's Chair in Wesleyan Studies at *Vanderbilt University*. He also directs the *Wendland-Cook Program in Religion and Justice* at the Vanderbilt Graduate Department of Religion and is an affiliated Faculty member of the *Turner Family Center for Social Ventures, Owen Graduate School of Management, Vanderbilt University*. Rieger is the author and editor of 26 books and more than 184 academic articles, with his most recent monograph being, *Theology in the Capitalocene: Ecology, Identity, Class, and Solidarity* (2022).
