Presbytery News

Synod 2025 will commence on **Saturday, August 30** with an Opening Worship service, which this year will include the installation of a new Moderator, **Rev Salesi Faupula**.

Opening Worship will be held at Kingswood College 355 Station St, Box Hill South commencing at **10am** and will be followed by morning tea.

Presbytery in Council will be meeting on **Saturday 13th September at Whitehorse Uniting Church, Mitcham**. Details of the agenda and reports will be sent out to Presbytery Members in due course.



The first gathering of conversations about Missional Things took place on Thursday 24 July at Koonung Heights-Surrey Hills, with 42 people attending. While most participants came from across Yarra Yarra Presbytery, we also had people join us from the Gippsland and Port Phillip East presbyteries, eLM and Uniting.

Lively discussion highlighted the diversity, creativity and passion evident across our congregations, as well as a strong collective desire to grow in mission together. People reflected on being open to change, shared stories about a variety of local missional activities and voiced a shared commitment to engaging with local communities.

There was value in the opportunity to connect with others across the church, to hear stories and share experiences. Feedback after the event indicates that participants found the discussion inspiring and energising, and there is good interest in holding future gatherings that focus more deeply on particular topics and missional practices. Future topics of interest include discussions on social enterprise, discipleship, faith-sharing in everyday conversations, worship as mission and practical insights into community engagement and compliance. There is also interest in bold thinking around new expressions of church and making better use of missional grants.

So stay tuned for news about future gatherings of conversations about Missional Things!



Café of Dangerous Ideas – 29th August 7:30pm



Neurodivergence is an umbrella term that encompasses any variation of brain wiring that significantly differs from what is typical brain functioning.

Dyslexia, dyspraxia, dyscalculia, tic disorders, obsessive-compulsive disorder, sensory processing disorder, post-traumatic stress disorder and many more brain-based differences all fall under the neurodiversity banner, but ADHD and autism seem to be getting much of the airtime. What difference does it make? How do we engage with, learn from and enjoy the variety that neurodiversity offers us in the way we think and act?

The Rev. Glen Wesley (from St Aidans Anglican in Strathmore) has done some work on how we integrate neurodiversity into Church life and will speak about his learnings at the Cafe of Dangerous Ideas - part of the Banyule Network of Uniting Churches - on **Friday the 29th August at 7.30pm**. 
