Presbytery Committee's – Resourcing & Property Committee

Are you interested in playing an important role within the life of Presbytery?

In this edition of PYY News we are taking a closer look at the



role the Resourcing & Property Committee plays as part of our Presbytery.

The Resourcing & Property Committee (R&PC) of the Presbytery of Yarra Yarra handles all property-related applications on behalf of the Presbytery under delegated authority. These are set out in the Regulations, and details are available on request.

It also, in conjunction with the Pastoral Relations Committee (PRC), exercises the Presbytery's general oversight over all congregations, studying their annual reports and financial statements. The current Chair is Alan Chuck, a retired civil engineer from the Auburn Congregation, and Frances Wright assists with minutes and correspondence. There are 10 elected members, whose term expires at the February 2025 Presbytery meeting.

However, a significant part of the Committee's work takes place between meetings, when individual members represent the Presbytery in Project Control Groups, and one or two specialist members conduct Manse inspections, or provide Pre-placement financial reports, at the request of congregations.

There is often a vacancy on the Committee, and expressions of interest are particularly invited from members of Presbytery who are younger, female or ordained. You are welcome to attend a meeting as an observer before committing to membership.

Meetings are held in the **evening on the third Thursday** of **every month** from January to November. Meetings are often held at congregational properties, or at Presbytery Office, or via Zoom.

Pause & Paint: An icon-painting workshop for teens

A two-day school holiday event for teens to learn the ancient art of icon painting.

Across the 2 days you will learn the skills you need to draw a face in perspective as well as the opportunity to try painting using the



style artists used over 500 years ago using the same type of materials: dry pigments in egg tempera.

The workshop will be led by UCA icon painting teacher Peter Blackwood. There will be opportunities to pause and pray and reflect each day as you paint. Participants can also pause and walk the labyrinth on site at the church, or to enjoy an icon exhibition. If you enjoy art and like thinking about faith, then this is for you.
